



## Fiscal 2026 Agency Overview

### **Office of the Labor Commissioner Mission**

#### **Service Description**

 This service conducts labor contract negotiations with eight City unions; meets and confers with one managerial and professional society; negotiates collective bargaining agreements with respect to wages, hours, benefits and other terms and conditions of employment.

#### **Major Operating Budget Highlights**

• The Recommended Budget reflects a \$1.9 million increase for the cost of legal fees for union negotiations. These costs were previously reflected elsewhere in the City's budget.
