

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Fiscal 2026 Agency Overview

Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety and Engagement's Mission

• The Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety and Engagement (MONSE) leads efforts to address crisis levels of gun violence today, while addressing broader social determinants of health for a safer and more equitable Baltimore.

Fiscal 2026 Goals

- Responsibly scale the Group Violence Reduction Strategy (GVRS) citywide
- Assess interventions
- Bring strategies to scale while fine-tuning operations



Service 617 - Criminal Justice Coordination

Service Description

• This service leads the City's coordination efforts between federal, state, and regional partners to prevent and intervene in violence.

Major Operating Budget Highlights

- Increasing funding by \$105,000 within the General Fund to support security costs for the Baltimore City Visitation Center which serves victims of domestic violence. This increase will provide 24/7 security services at the Visitation Center managed by the City.
- An overall 70% increase in anticipated state and federal grants. Increased funding supports the creation of two new positions and expanding operations at the City's visitation center.

Service Description

• This service identifies evidence-based approaches to improving public safety and reducing crime outside of the traditional law enforcement context.

Major Operating Budget Highlights

- Transferring funding for 12 positions that were previously funded through ARPA to the City's General Fund. These positions support data analysis, program coordination, and community engagement to support the Group Violence Reduction Strategy.
- A new State Grant under the Performance Incentive Grant Fund (JRA GF) program for \$278,250 for Supportive Housing for Returning Citizens in Baltimore City.
